REFLECTION FOR THIS WEEKEND

GOD'S STORY, OUR STORY: LIVING A BETTER STORY

Mark 16:1-8 is such a strange and abrupt way to end the Story, don't you think? With women running out of the cemetery, their dresses hiked up to their knees, scared out of their wits because of what they'd just seen and heard.

What kind of ending is this, anyway? I feel this every time I come to the conclusion of Mark's Gospel. There's no closure! Mark leaves us hanging! Then what? We wonder. What happened next?

The story feels unfinished, doesn't it? Whether or not this is how Mark intended to end his Gospel, in the providence of God this is the way the Story has been preserved and handed down to us. But as it turns out, it's actually quite an effective way to end the Story.

Don't you see? Mark's Gospel, and the Easter Story, goes on with us! It goes on through us. We take our place with the women and the disciples. The Easter Story continues in the ordinary places and in the ordinary relationships where you and I live and work and play and struggle and laugh and cry. "He is going ahead of you," the angel says to us. "There you will see Him, just as He told you."

The Easter Story goes on every time someone realizes that they're not in control of their lives, and that it is in losing your life to Jesus that we find it. It goes on every time a sinner is forgiven and broken relationships are mended.

It goes on when the hungry are fed and the homeless are given shelter and when the lonely are embraced. It goes on when the sick and the prisoner are visited, and those in grief are comforted. It goes on when parents press on to raise their children faithfully in the ways of God, when husbands and wives strive to honour their vows, when business people do what is right regardless of the cost.

It goes on every time we give up on our own selfish agendas and take up God's agenda in the world—seeking peace, advocating justice, caring for the poor, standing with those who suffer, and calling people to put their trust in the Crucified and Risen Saviour who is turning the world upside down and right side up.

Think about that. Your story right now, no matter how insignificant or ordinary or even tragic it may seem to you, is part of Jesus' Story. You can live a better and more beautiful story. Jesus has been set loose and is at work in your story, in your life. He's already gone ahead of you. Into your marriage. Into your home. Into your neighbourhood. Into that difficult situation at work. Into the classroom. Into the waiting room at the hospital. Into even the painful and disappointing and scary moments of your life. He's already there, one step ahead of us. And He promises to bring light where there is darkness, life where there is death, healing where there is brokenness, and hope where all hope seems lost.

No, Mark never intended to end the Gospel. In you and me, the story goes on! So, in the power of the Holy Spirit, let us get into the Story and live this Story out for God's glory and for the sake of the world.

Christ is risen! *He is risen, indeed!*

SCRIPTURE LESSON

Mark 16: 1-8 (New International Version)

Jesus Has Risen

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

⁶ "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'"

Mark's Gospel

WHY DO BIBLE SCHOLARS TAKE MARK 16:8 AS THE REAL ENDING?

The principle of the harder & shorter reading is more authentic.

It was harder for first century culture to trust that 3 women were eyewitnesses (as women could not testify in a court of law then) thus making the account authentic.

Why the abrupt ending?

To stress the **REALITY OF FEAR** in post-resurrection time.

Dealing with Post-Resurrection Fear

HOW SHOULD WE RESPOND?

OPENING PRAYER (*in unison*)

Father, help us not to grudge these few minutes that we worship You. Help us not to regard it as just a formality that we go through on Sundays. Help us today to really listen to Your voice, to really speak to You, so that we may be made more and more in the image of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Thank You again for the freedom and privilege to worship You in our own homes. This we ask in Jesus' name, **Amen.**

INTERCESSION *(each person can be encouraged to say a prayer based on the items below or one person could be assigned to pray all the items below)*

1. We must practice social distancing without being socially disconnected from one another. Pray that everyone in our family and church community is being reached out to and ministered to in some ways.
2. For Malaysia and the rest of the world to heal from the Covid-19 pandemic.
3. Pray for those who are at the verge of losing their jobs or have lost them. Pray their needs will be met.
4. Any other prayers the family wishes to bring to God. End the intercession with the **Lord's Prayer**:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

READING OF THE BIBLE (*read aloud together by all present or one verse per person*)

Acts 28:1-10 (English Standard Version)

¹ After we were brought safely through, we then learned that the island was called Malta. ² The native people showed us unusual kindness, for they kindled a fire and welcomed us all, because it had begun to rain and was cold. ³ When Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks and put them on the fire, a viper came out because of the heat and fastened on his hand. ⁴ When the native people saw the creature hanging from his hand, they said to one another, “No doubt this man is a murderer. Though he has escaped from the sea, Justice has not allowed him to live.” ⁵ He, however, shook off the creature into the fire and suffered no harm. ⁶ They were waiting for him to swell up or suddenly fall down dead. But when they had waited a long time and saw no misfortune come to him, they changed their minds and said that he was a god.

⁷ Now in the neighborhood of that place were lands belonging to the chief man of the island, named Publius, who received us and entertained us hospitably for three days. ⁸ It happened that the father of Publius lay sick with fever and dysentery. And Paul visited him and prayed, and putting his hands on him, healed him. ⁹ And when this had taken place, the rest of the people on the island who had diseases also came and were cured. ¹⁰ They also honored us greatly, and when we were about to sail, they put on board whatever we needed.

SERMON (to be read aloud by one person)

MISSIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Acts 28:1-10 shows us that every circumstance or situation is a missional opportunity. In the shipwreck Paul witnesses with the peace of God. When bitten by a snake he witnesses with his un-anxious attitude. When he sees the sick, he witnesses with the power of God. Paul was missional at all times and in every situation.

Paul was being taken as a prisoner to Rome when the shipwrecked. Having safely reached an island Paul and others were treated kindly by the natives. When Paul picked a bundle of sticks and put them in the fire a snake probably awakened and bit him. He was not disturbed by the snake bite. He just shook it off. When others saw Paul's reaction, they saw God at work in Paul.

Then Paul went to stay with Publius, whose father was sick. Paul prayed for him and Publius's father was healed. He prayed for one and as a result many sick persons came. Paul had experienced a shipwreck. He could have sat and sulked and blamed God for the tragedy. Instead he uses his personal tragedy as an opportunity to be faithful to his calling and opportunity to minister to those who were hurting.

Our reaction to pain and attacks either creates missional opportunities or hinders the missional opportunity. If we would handle our pains, disappointments and troubles well by the grace of God, we become 'wounded healers.'

Pandita Ramabai was an Indian who turned to Christ. At the age of 23 when her husband died, she was left with a young daughter. Because of her condition she experienced firsthand the atrocious treatment of women in India. This firsthand experience of destitution, widowhood, and poverty made her resilient. She was

verbally attacked by because of the ministries she was doing. Her wounds did not paralyze her. It became a source of healing to others. These experiences propelled her to go forward in life to help others in similar condition. In one of the homes that she had founded at one time she had 2000 children and women. She died in 1922. For her services to the nation, the Indian Government issued a commemorative stamp in 1989. Our pains can create missional opportunities.

Remember Paul was in chains. He was a prisoner. Eventually he will be brought to Rome to be tried as a prisoner for having preached Christ. But still he ministered to everyone he came across.

We will always have limitations. For some of us, age becomes our chains. Some feel they are too old to do anything for God. George Muller when he turned 70 fulfilled a life-long dream of missionary work for the next 17 years until he was 87. He traveled to 42 countries, preaching at least once a day ministering to some three million people all together. Some on the other hand feel they are too young to serve. Patricia lived in one of the crowded slum communities of Santa Mesa, Manila which was known as a breeding ground for thieves, criminals and prostitutes. Patricia decided to teach the noisy and rude children there the Bible so that they can change their ways. She gathered these unruly children aged 5 to 10 years old to teach them about Jesus. Patricia herself was only 12 years old.

Covid-19 pandemic is real. It has forced us into social distancing. It has become either like a pain that has hindered some of us or like a chain that limits some of us. But during a time like this some people have become creative by finding different ways to minister to those near and far. Everyone faces some kind of limitation, but limitations should not stop us from doing what God wants to achieve through us. We learn from the Apostle Paul that the missional Christian is not discouraged by shipwrecks,

attacks, sickness, chains, and troubles. The missional Christian sees difficulties, hindrances diseases and pandemics as opportunities to display the power and compassion of God. The missional Christian is not limited by adverse circumstances. The missional Christian seizes every opportunity to be a witness for Christ.

PRAYERS FOR THE WEEK

1. Praise God that the Easter Story reminds us that He will always create a way to get His will completed, that God will move any stone or obstacle that is in the way, in order that His glorious purposes be fulfilled and completed. Praise Him for the assurance that Jesus has risen from the dead, and so, we also will be raised because we believe in Him. Praise God and thank Him for the promise of new life forever in Christ. Pray that we will always trust that because God loves us so much that He conquered death that threatened our eternity, He can, and will help us handle the problems that we are facing now. Pray also that He will give us the courage to tell others of Christ's resurrection.
2. Praise God that in our battle against Covid-19, the number of cases that have recovered are more than 50% of the total number of confirmed cases of infection in the nation. Pray for wisdom for the health ministry & the health director-general, and the medical experts to know how to contain the coronavirus, and stop it from spreading so rapidly. Pray also that the rakyat will realize the importance of cooperating, and working with the government, and do their part by complying with the MCO. Pray for the police officers, and other public servants working tirelessly, often without adequate protection, that God will give them stamina every day and keep them from falling ill. Pray for those who have turned to faith in Jesus for the very first time during this pandemic that the Lord will help them grow in the grace and knowledge of our Savior, and become life-long disciples of Christ. Pray that God will lead many prodigals to return to Him in genuine repentance. Pray that, in His loving kindness, God will, through the conviction of the Holy Spirit, lead many who do not know Jesus to repentance and obedient faith in Him.

5. Pray for those who are infected with the virus, that God will grace them with His presence, comfort and peace as they face their sickness in isolation, and grant them His healing. Pray for those who are most vulnerable to the virus: the elderly and those with chronic diseases, that God will grant them His protection. Pray for those who are staying in nursing homes, that God will encourage these lonely residents and strengthen the staff members who care for them. Pray that the Lord will keep them safe from the virus. Pray also that He will comfort their family members who are not able to visit them at this juncture. Pray that God will watch over those who are staying alone by themselves, and that relatives / friends will stay connected with them, to ensure that they stay safe. Pray also for those who are dying alone in hospitals, and for their loved ones, that God will draw close to them, and enable them to encounter Christ, the Friend who never leaves nor forsakes them.

6. The Covid-19 pandemic has huge economic impact throughout the world: from the costs of managing the health of people, and the need to keep the economy working. While the people's welfare is of top priority, the people's economic survival is equally crucial. Pray for wisdom for the leaders of the world to make the right key decisions to take quick and adequate steps to face the coming world-wide economic slowdown as they work towards suppressing the pandemic, but at the same time, allowing the economy to still function. Pray for business leaders who have to make difficult decisions that affect the lives of their employees, that God will give them wisdom and compassion to make

the right decisions. Pray for workers in a variety of industries facing layoffs and financial hardship, that God will provide for their basic needs through the generous support of the community, and especially the churches.

7. Pray for all of us in Klang Wesley that during this time of the MCO, we will use our time wisely, even as we have to stay at home most of the time. Pray that we will choose to seek God, and develop a deeper, more meaningful relationship with Him, where we will grow in faith and dependence on Him. Pray for forgiveness that we have given too much time and attention to other things, and ask the Lord to remove the distractions in our lives that have kept us from His presence. Pray that as we are confronted by this pandemic that has taken so many lives, we will reflect on our priorities in this life, on whether we have sought temporal security in possessions instead of eternal security in God. Pray that He will reveal to us any of the ways we have been preoccupied with the things of the world, and lead us to repent for bowing to the gods of materialism and worldly success.
