



DEAR BROTHERS & SISTERS IN CHRIST,

Originally known in the Old Testament as the Feast of Weeks, Pentecost was a day's celebration of the grain harvest that God blessed His people with. It was one of

three major festivals in the Jewish calendar. However, in the year that Jesus was crucified, raised to life, and finally ascended to heaven, this festival took on monumental significance. It was the birth of the Church. The Church began with three thousand believers and rapidly increased over time to several billion (not including the saints of yesteryears).

Christianity was to soon emerge as a new faith apart from Judaism, as some Jews believed in Jesus, but many other Jews failed to recognize Jesus as their Messiah. Conversely, thousands of Gentiles (non-Jews) believed in Jesus as their Lord and Saviour, and joined in the body of believers who embraced God's rich and unfolding Kingdom. This was not surprising because God's original intention was to draw all humanity back to Him, through God's Son, Jesus Christ.

Even as Jewish Christians soon abandoned their religious practices that seemed meaningless in the light of Christ's perfect sacrifice for our salvation, Christians in 2020, like us, have to rethink "doing church" in the devastation that this global pandemic has done to all of us. Circumstances force us to do things differently – which is not bad, per se. For one, God has pressed the "pause" button in our lives to help us see the wretchedness of being caught up in the whirlwind of this rat race for years on end that has insidiously eroded our time with God and with our family members.

Churches like ours have refused to be content by not wanting to meet and connect with each other in brotherly and sisterly love. In order to do this, we have to embrace modern technology like internet conference calls. We have refused to stop meeting together to pray, and thus were able to continuously and daily meet for 52 consecutive mornings during the MCO, over online prayers.

The early believers prayed together (Acts 1:14) and God was pleased with their unity of purpose. No wonder God poured out His Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost so that people could believe that Tesus is indeed Lord and Saviour

A blessed Pentecost Sunday to all of you.

REFLECTION FOR THIS WEEKEND

FUELED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. (Acts 2:1-4)

What an incredible experience that must have been -- to actually see tongues of flame resting on each of them as they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Many of us feel that access to that kind of power is no longer available. In fact we can sometimes feel our faith becoming dry and lifeless, as if the energy we once had for service has left us. Yet the Holy Spirit is available to you today as He has always been, waiting for you to ask for His presence and power. This example has been given to us throughout the Bible – in both the Old and New Testaments.

One story that comes to mind, involves the Old Testament prophet, Ezekiel (Ezekiel 37:1-14) who was given a vision in which the Lord instructed him to prophesy to a valley full of bones.

"So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them."

The bones came together, but there was no life -- they rattled together. The same is true for us when we try to work for the

Lord in our own power without the Holy Spirit's power or enabling -- there's no life in us either. Verse 9 continues,

"Then He said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe into these slain, that they may live.' "So I prophesied as He commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet a vast army."

The Bible often uses the words "wind" or "breath" to indicate the presence of the Holy Spirit. It is this breath of God, His Holy Spirit that comes upon us and into us -- powers and empowers us for service. The key to our receiving this power is obedience. In verse 10, Ezekiel says, "So I prophesied as He commanded me." In other words, Ezekiel obeyed. In Acts 1:12, the Apostles returned to Jerusalem and waited in the upper room as Jesus had commanded (Acts 1:4). They were obedient as well.

If you are feeling spiritually dry, or maybe you're just going through the motions of Christian life without any significant purpose or direction, then it's time to ask God through His Spirit to reveal to you in what area of your life you need to obey. Ask God's Holy Spirit to fill you as you are obedient and empowered to humbly serve Him.

God's work in our life as well as usefulness in the Kingdom is typically interrupted when we fail to obey a God directive. What was the last thing God told you to do or change that you haven't quite finished? (MIKE BROOKS)

THE BASICS OF LIFE

The day was Pentecost. Three thousand people became devoted to Jesus Christ. It was the birthday of the Church. Earlier there had been only a small band of followers who listened to Jesus' teachings. But with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the Church was born.

These fully devoted followers of Christ took the Good News of salvation to heart. Their lives changed. They found a new focus, a new devotion

- They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching. It was a message of grace and hope--unlike any ever heard before. No longer would the world have to chase after God, for God had come in search of the world.
- They devoted themselves to the fellowship of believers. Not only did they love God, but they obeyed Jesus' command to love one another. They cared and provided for each others' needs and held each other accountable.
- They devoted themselves to the breaking of bread.
 Together they took the time to remember and believe that the Body of Christ was given for the complete forgiveness of all their sins
- They devoted themselves to prayer conversation with God. They not only spoke to God but also listened for and learned God's will for the life of the church.

Teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer – are these the key focal points in your walk with God? (JERRY DYKSTRA)

SCRIPTURE LESSON

Acts 2: 29 - 47 (New International Version)

29 "Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. 30 But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. 31 Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. 32 God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. 33 Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. 34 For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said,

"The Lord said to my Lord:
"Sit at my right hand
until I make your enemies
a footstool for your feet."

36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."

40 With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." 41 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

The Fellowship of the Believers

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

PRAYERS FOR THE WEEK

- 1. Praise God that He continues to pour His Holy Spirit upon His people in the 21st century. Pray that He will pour out His Spirit afresh in each of us today, that He will birth in us a deeper love for Christ, so that we will delight in fellowship with Him, and be disciplined in His ways. Pray that the gift of the Holy Spirit will continue to change the direction of our lives in ways that are pleasing to the Lord, and we will bear lasting fruit for His Kingdom. Pray that by the transforming power of the Holy Spirit, we may follow the example of the Early Church and continually devote ourselves to discipleship and evangelism. Pray that the Lord will help us build true fellowship within our church through breaking down any walls of hostility we may have erected against each other. Pray that He will make us to be of one heart and one mind and one accord, devoted to God and His Kingdom values, generous in giving, passionate in sharing the Good News, and glad to participate in anything that advances His Kingdom work in the midst of a world which has been ravished by Covid-19.
- 2. Pray for pastors and church leaders during this time of Covid-19. Pastors and their church leaders around the country have to make difficult decisions related to public worship, church ministries and the safety of their members. Pray that pastors and church leaders will have the wisdom to faithfully shepherd the congregations under their care, even if they are unable to physically gather together as a congregation, and the pastors and leaders are not able to do home / hospital visitations because of the coronavirus. Pray that God

will help the pastor and church leaders discover new and creative ways to reach out to the people under their care, and to encourage them with God's comfort, peace, hope, and love. Pray that the pastors and leaders will remain spiritually healthy, and spend time in God's presence, and be sensitive to what God is speaking to them through His Word, and then responding to Him in prayer and worship. Pray that during this difficult time, they will, by the grace of God, grow stronger in their faith, and be more committed disciples of Christ. Pray that they, and their families, will remain physically healthy by taking responsibility to practice the social disciplines, and that God's hedge of protection will always be upon them.

3. People living alone, especially those who are elderly, may have increased feelings of isolation, loneliness, anxiety and helplessness during these tough and uncertain times of the pandemic. Bring before the Lord the following: people who live alone and have gone without human company and contact for weeks / months; senior adults living in nursing homes, wondering when they will be able to see their loved ones again; anyone fighting a mental illness that worsens in isolation. Pray that God provide them with every necessary support, that there will be people who will reach out to these people in creative, yet safe ways so as to alleviate their need for human company and contact. Pray that friends and relatives will make time to connect with them regularly through WhatsApp messages and phone calls, or even leave notes and cards at their doorsteps so they will know they are not forgotten. Pray that people will also help them with their basic necessities of food, groceries and toiletries. Above all,

- pray that God's love and presence will bring comfort, peace and strength to them, and He will protect them from the coronavirus.
- 4 Praise God that the latest data has shown that there is a decrease of the novel coronavirus infection rate among Malaysians, although the current issue facing the authorities is the increase in infection rate among illegal immigrants at Immigration Department depots. The other concern for the authorities is whether the recent Hari Raya festive season had any impact on the pandemic's rate of infection in the nation. Pray for God's wisdom upon the health authorities to handle all these issues so that the number of new infections can be brought lower. By June 9, 2020, the authorities should be able to make a decision, and if the low number of cases can still be sustained by then, taking into account the festive season, then more of the social and education sectors can be reopened. Pray for God's guidance upon the authorities for the right timing for reopening of schools and more social sectors. Pray that the public will continue to be vigilant, and continue to work hand in hand with the Health Ministry by maintaining their social responsibility, discipline and compliance to break the chain of Covid-19 transmission in the country.
- 5. Pray for the El-Shaddai Refugee Learning Centre (ERLC) that has been closed since the MCO began on March 18, 2020. Thank God that the ERLC committee has been able to pay the salaries of the teachers for the past 3 months, with a small pay cut. Pray for the online teachers' training conducted for all the teachers twice a week during this

lockdown that it will benefit the teachers, and greatly enhance their ability, passion and zeal to teach their students when school reopens. Pray for the 8 students preparing for the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) who are currently doing their studies via online teaching by their teachers, and pray that the students will be able to prepare well for the IGCSE exams. As the other students are unable to have online classes, pray that schools will be allowed to reopen soon, and that the new procedures will be acceptable to all. Praise God that the members of the ERLC committee were able to bring food items and cash vouchers to many of the students' families during the MCO. Pray for the wellbeing of the students as they have been adversely affected by the MCO, with some families struggling to pay for their house rentals.

6. In response to the official announcement made by the nation's authorities about the conditional opening up of religious places of worship following the latest SOP, pray for wisdom upon the Heads of Churches of the Christian Federation of Malaysia (CFM) as they submit applications of individual churches under their care for reopening. Pray for favour on each application. Pray that local church leaders and pastors will trust God for wisdom to know the way forward regarding church worship services and ministries in the church. Pray for God's creative grace and strength upon churches as they continue to prepare their online worship services, that the services will bless and edify the people as they worship the Lord in their homes. Pray that Christians will give priority to these online worship services, and make it a point to come before God each weekend to worship Him,

trusting Him that He is sovereign and is in control of this situation.

The number of Covid-19 infections worldwide have reached almost 6 million (May 29, 2020), and the rate of infections in many nations are still in the thousands and tens of thousands. The doctors, nurses and all health care workers are physical and mentally exhausted after months of caring for the sick, with no end in sight. Thank God for these brave women and men who are closest to the sick and suffering. Pray for God's protection upon them and their families as they protect those who are infected and vulnerable, and for strength and hope when they are discouraged and tired. Pray that they will have physical and emotional support, and be ensured that they have proper personal protective equipment at all times. Pray for those who have suffered during this global pandemic that God will sustain, console, and heal them. Pray for the leaders of all the nations, especially in nations with very high infection rates that God will grant them wisdom to respond to the challenges of this pandemic with prudence and sound judgment, that with foresight, their planning may protect lives, alleviate economic burdens, compensate for losses, employment and ensure ample food for the poor and isolated.
