A. Introduction

If God allows you to ask Him only one question, what would you ask?

1. One important question (v.28)

Which commandment is the most important of all?

2. Jesus' reply (vv.29-31)

- v.29: Jesus quotes from Deuteronomy 6:4.
- v.30: quotation from Deuteronomy 6:5.
- ▶ v.31: quotation from Leviticus 19:18b.

3. The scribe's response (vv.32-33):

- v.32: responded positively to Jesus.
- v.33: he pints down the underlying issue of the religious leaders.
- ▶ Following the law in a <u>legalistic</u> way: the letter of law, while ignoring the Spirit of the law.

Explanation

- ▶ What it means to be devout in God's *truest* sense: to worship Him rightly?
- Motive of asking.
- test: if Jesus answers rightly.
- to love Him *only* as our God.
- ▶ to love Him with our whole being.
- loving God means loving those he loves rightly as well.
- Our neighbor includes our *enemy* too (Parable of the *Good Samaritan*).
- Do you find Jesus' command is so hard to obey?
- he agrees with Jesus the command is right & good.
- God's command demands total obedience over sacrifices.
- See 1 Samuel 15:22; Hosea 6:6; Proverbs 21:3.

4. Jesus' commendation (v.34)

v.34: You are **not** far from the kingdom of God.

Explanation

▶ The scribe is just *a step* **closer** to be in the kingdom of God.

▶ He must *believe* & *submit* to the lordship of Jesus-the *source* of eternal salvation.

B.Reflection & Application:

How do we respond to these two great commandments?

- How do we treat them as God is speaking to us today?
- What do they mean to us?

Model Jesus:

Consider Jesus in your life...

- Was there any portion of the heart of Christ that was not completely in love with the
- Did Jesus hold anything back from his soul when had to do the will of the Father?
- Was there anything that the Father revealed that Jesus ignored as not worthy of his attention?

• **Conclusion:** remember what Jesus says:

• "Don't forget the Cross. When you come together, come to My Table. Look at My body, look at My blood. Show it forth until I come again."
