
The Church in Jesus' Parables Matthew 13: 51-58

INTRODUCTION

 The parables of the sower and the wheat & tares are about God's church

- The seeds and ground conditions: disciples' relationship with the gospel
- The wheat and tares: discipler's relationship with the gospel.
- b) The parables of the mustard seed and the woman kneading bread dough are about Jesus' vision of the Church and its compelling growth.
- c) The parables of the pearl of great price & the land and the buried treasure are about the Church being of great price and eternal.
- d) The parable of the net full of fish is about God's people, His church, a people walking well, living well and growing well in Christ. Jesus shows us the way to live well, walk well and grow well in Him. Jesus says, all who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old.

The Epworth League:

Founded in May 1889 and within 10 years it grew to over 1.75 million members in 19,500 chapters internationally.

- 2. To encourage and cultivate <u>Christ-centered</u> character in young adults around the world through community building, missions, and spiritual growth.

3. The League takes its name from the village of Epworth, England, the birthplace of John and Charles Wesley.

 Approximately 60% of 18–35 years old would consider returning to church if someone they knew asked them to come back.



The Motivating Factors for Reconnecting with Church

- 1. Returning to church brings them back closer to God
- 2. Returning to church fills the spiritual and emotional gaps
- 3. Returning to church connecting with likeminded community who share their values
- 4. Returning to church to make a difference
